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Asymmetry Sweater by Arenda Holladay

Students of my Basics Basics Basics class no doubt get tired of my harping on symmetry in my comments on paired increases and decreases but asymmetry can be used for effect as in this sweater. Similar to a sweater I designed for the May-July 2011 Cast On, as part of the issue on elongated stitches, this fitted sweater has "ruffles" at the bottom, cuffs and neck. I had this silhouette in mind as I walked the show floor at TNNA in Columbus. As soon as I saw Anzula's Cole, I knew I had found the right yarn. For a yarn with a gauge of 16 stitches over four inches it is amazingly light. The drape of the resulting fabric is lovely. Nothing cheers up a winter day like a red sweater so the only color I considered was Red Shoe. The sleeves are extra long. There are saddle shoulders.

Growing up in Southern California, one of my favorite things to do with my best friend was strolling up and down the less populated areas of Laguna Beach on cold windy days – with bare feet, blue jeans rolled up our calves, and cuddly warm sweaters keeping the chill away as we danced in the sand and the incoming tide. The Cormo yarn used in this sweater is soft, very strong and highly resilient – providing wonderful stitch definition for both the pebbly surface of the Moss Stitch and the centered Serpentine Cable pattern. Keeping the cables in the center of the sweater also helps create a garment that can be flattering on a variety of figures.

This sweater has been designed with 1-3" of ease added onto your actual bust measurement. The fronts are 2-3" wider at the bust than the back for two obvious reasons but also to reduce button band gap. The buttons are fairly close together which also helps. The body is slightly flared.

Fiddleback Cowl by Heather Storta

Fiddleback wood, or Flame Maple, is a beautiful wood grain often used to make fiddles and guitars. When I came across this particular cable pattern it reminded me of the lovely undulating wood grain of the back of a fiddle. This wide cowl starts with a short section of rib, which flows right into the cabled pattern. While not technically reversible, the wrong side of the fabric is attractive in its own way. Worked in a fingering weight yarn, the cowl has a nice drape and would be a warm and fashionable way to keep the winter chill away.



Men's Half Zip Pullover by Lorna Miser


