Master Hand Knitting Certification

The Master Hand Knitting Program is the cornerstone of all our programs. Since its inception in 1987, knitters have been challenging themselves to become elite knitters. The program was designed as an educational process, not a competition or contest. The program is not for new knitters, but for those who want to improve their skills. For each of the three levels of the program, you will knit swatches, write reports, answer questions, and complete projects. Levels establish proficiency in:

Level 1 basic knitting skills.

Level 2 finishing, pattern writing, and the ability to work basic cable, lace, and color work.

Level 3 advanced techniques and stitch work.

Upon completion you will have a mastery of many knitting techniques, knowledge of the history and traditions of knitting, experience in garment design and pattern writing, but more importantly you will have the confidence in your own abilities. Where this confidence takes you is up to you.

Professional Knitter Certification

This course is designed for those who want to take their work to the next level for their personal satisfaction or to fulfill professional goals as sample knitters or finishers. The swatches and projects will demonstrate the candidate's ability to interpret instructions and patterns, and identify potential pattern errors. Each module includes questions that require no research, just observation. An important part of this program is time management. Work for each module must be submitted with one year of purchase.

Module 1 tests the knitter's skill in basic techniques and the ability to work to gauge by knitting swatches.

Module 2 tests the knitter's ability to reproduce more complicated stitch patterns from pattern instructions. The knitter's finishing is tested by knitting and finishing two baby sweaters.

Module 3 provides information and tips for successfully working with designers. The graduation project is a "real world" situation in which the student works with the instructor to determine a time frame for completing the project, and then does so. Completing this course will give you the confidence and ability to succeed in the knitting industry as a true professional.
