How to Market Yourself within the Knitting Industry

Are you ready to begin a career in the knitting industry or take your knitting career to the next level? We live in a time where people are rejecting traditional advertising. You can be the best designer, instructor, or tech editor in the world but it doesn't matter if no one knows about you.

This course takes the framework of educational and professional marketing programs to create a tailored course with specific strategies for knitting professionals. It is a powerhouse of knowledge designed to increase sales for your knitting business. By the end of the course you will have developed your brand, formed a marketing strategy, created a unique Brand Guide, Marketing Tracking, Campaign Development, and comprehensive Marketing Plan.

This course is divided into two modules. Module 1 includes defining your brand, identifying your target market, creating content, core marketing outlets, creating opportunities, and analysis. Module 2 includes setting up software, social media engagement, pricing, cross-promoting, selling yourself, business of marketing, and campaign development.

Pattern Writing Basics

This course will teach you how to write a quality pattern following a template. Avoid being the cause of frustration and instead, send patterns out into the knitting world with confidence. If you're working on the MKH Program, you'll love having comprehensive pattern knowledge so that you're able to write patterns to the MHK template more easily. If you're designing, this means less pattern support, as well as less tech editing time, and a better reputation in the industry for your pattern writing skills. You will learn elements of good pattern writing: what information needs to be included and where, the order in which to present it, how to write stitch patterns, and clear instructions. This course does not include knitting.

This course is divided into three lessons. Lesson 1 teaches you the information to be included in a pattern and the order in which it is usually presented. Lesson 2 covers writing directions, charts, and schematics. In Lesson 3, we put it all together to write a full pattern. Lessons are emailed to the instructor who reviews the work.
