

Endless Loop Scarf by Jennifer Kent

Beyond the Pattern

I love scarves, especially those that I can wear year round. This scarf is knit flat, then joined into an oversized continuous loop. This makes it versatile enough to wear as a long easy cowl, or, if wrapped on itself multiple times, a shorter neck warmer. The openwork mesh lace stitch allows air to pass through and keeps the scarf from becoming too heavy when worn in warmer climates. I think it just may become my most favorite summer scarf!



Sizes

One size

Finished Measurements

Circumference: 66"

Width: 9.5"

Materials

Rowan SOFTYAK DK (148yds/135m, 50g/1.76oz, 76% Cotton, 15% Yak, 9% Nylon): 4 skeins #235

Pampas

Size 7 (4.5mm) needles and dpns for 3-needle BO or size needed to obtain gauge

Waste yarn (WY)

Stitch holder

Tapestry needle

Gauge

In Net Lace pat, 20 sts & 28 rows = 4"/10cm. To save time, take time to check gauge.

Stitch Patterns

See Net Lace Chart.



Construction Notes

This scarf is worked flat—back and forth in rows—from bottom to top. A provisional cast on and 3-needle BO are utilized to create a continuous loop when joined.

Scarf

Using a Provisional CO and WY, CO 47 sts.
Work Net Lace pat until piece measures 66".
Place 47 sts on st holder or WY.

Finishing

Weave in tails and block to finished measurements.

Place 47 sts from CO onto one needle and remove WY. Place 47 sts from holder or waste yarn onto second needle. Work 3-needle BO.


Weave in tails and steam/spritz block as needed.
